In conjunction with WISE@OU, we will be sending to all chairs and program directors a brief seven question survey on mentoring in your department/unit and how WISE and CETL may assist with your mentoring efforts.

- 2. On the Chairs' Corner, you will also find a link to the full "Reappointment and Promotion Guide" put together by the Department of Sociology, Anthropology, Social Work & Criminal Justice. This document was also discussed at the December workshop. The guide provides review timelines, the tenure review schedule for every type of faculty appointment as mandated by the AAUP contract and a comparison of the procedural requirements regarding scholarship, teaching and service across the faculty review bodies (department/college/university). The document can be easily adapted for use by any unit by substituting their unit's information.
- 3. A 2016 national study of Chairs you might find interesting is also posted on the Chairs' corner. Among many interesting findings, it notes that only a third of chairs receive any formal training once they received their appointment. The study compares results from a similar study conducted in 1991. I highly recommend you take a look at it.

- 3. **Provost's Evidence of Teaching Effectiveness Initiative** Please view information on the initiative and task force at: https://www.oakland.edu/cetl/ou-teaching-initiatives/ During the fall the task force developed the following potential recommendations:
 - a. Determine name of survey for OU tentative "End-of-Course Student Feedback" survey.
 - b. Create a survey that includes both campus-wide questions and additional questions customized by schools, departments, individual faculty, and online.
 - c. Design survey to include both "rating" questions and comments.
 - d. Set consistent "rating" scale 1-5 with 5 being the highest/top rating.
 - e. Design survey to include campus-wide questions about instructor, instruction, format (e.g. online), course and student demographics.
 - f. Develop a system that includes a "contextual narrative" where faculty can respond to survey with brief explanation of results (e.g. new method used, switched to online, much larger class size than usual).
 - g. Distribute ESF surveys online with a plan to increase online response rates (e.g. for face-to-face classes, students have time in class to complete online survey, reminders sent out, survey open for 7-10 days).

Goals for winter 2017 include:

- Develop campus wide- questions
- Develop system to select customizable questions (per school, department, instructor)
- Explore on-line systems
- Develop review procedures.
- Develop implantation plan.


