Course Description:

Comprehensive study of probate administration in Michigan, with the main focus on post-death administration of decedent estates. Other areas of instruction include trust administration/litigation, as well as guardianship and conservatorship proceedings.

Course Requirements:

Written assignments, including drafting of probate pleadings based on a fictional decedent's probate estate from commencement through completion of the administration, class participation, textbook and outside readings, and weekly quizzes. Sessions and written assignments will incorporate textbook and/or supplemental materials provided to students.

The following competencies should be achieved: substantive knowledge and the ability to apply a fundamental understanding of the various post-death probate administrations in Michigan, the role the paralegal plays in assisting attorneys and clients with the probate administration process, understanding of both the procedural and substantive elements required as a probate paralegal, written and oral communication proficiencies.
