Recent Changes Oakland transfer equivalency credit:

- LCC HUMS 213= OU Western Civilization Gen Ed, must be transferred in before the start of Fall Semester 2019.

Notes:

- Students must have a minimum cumulative transfer GPA of 2.8 and have completed at least intermediate algebra in order to be admitted to OU as a pre-business major.
- Math prerequisites: MATH 107 = MTH 0661 at OU, MATH 109 or 112 = MTH 0662 at OU
