Recent Changes to OU transfer credit equivalency:

Mott HIST 152 may be used to satisfy OU Global Perspective or Western Civilization category of General Education, must be transferred in before the start of Fall Semester 2019.

Mott HIST 151 may be used to satisfy OU Western Civilization General Education category, must be transferred in before the start of Fall Semester 2019
