## Senior Year Timeline: September to December

• Sign up for the ACT if you have not taken it, or if you are not satisfied with your score.

• Visit with your school counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate and fulfill college admission requirements.

• Start asking for personal references from teachers, school counselors, or employers now or at least three

weeks before application deadline.

- Begin writing a personal statement and college essay(s).
- Visit with admissions counselors who come to your high school.
- Attend as many college fairs as possible.
- Apply for admissions at the colleges you've chosen.
- Find out if you qualify for scholarships at each college where you have applied.
- Start gathering the information you will need to begin financial aid applications.
- See your school counselor for help finding financial aid and scholarships
- Keep working hard all year; second semester grades can affect scholarship eligibility.
- You must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

\*Rule of Thumb: Apply to all the colleges/ universities you would like to attend by Halloween of your senior year.

Get in the habit of collecting and saving important documents such as:

- ✓ Report Cards
- ✓ Awards (list of award won/received )
- Extracurricular Activities (list of activities you are involved in)
- Community Service Projects ( list of volunteer projects )
- Employment (Resume)

#### Hello Parents,

Oakland University GEAR UP Program is looking to support you and your student during their senior year in high school. GEAR UP wants to work closely with GU parents by providing you with steps and information to help your graduating senior make the best choices for college. Here are few things you can do this fall to help your student for a successful senior year and beyond.

- 1. If your student is not satisfied with SAT/ACT scores, suggest a re-take.
- 2. Help your senior narrow college possibilities and collect applications.
- 3. Work with your student to complete college applications approximately two weeks before they are due. Offer to proofread them. Verify that the school guidance office is sending transcripts and test scores to the colleges your student has chosen.
- 4. Go on as many campus visits as possible between now and December .

- 5. Check college policies.
- 6. Attend as many college fairs and financial aid workshops as possible.
- 7. Help your student search online for scholarships and for general information about financial aid issues.
- 8. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid *FAFSA*..
