

Post-Exposure Incident Checklist

The following steps must be taken, and information provided, in the event of an employee's exposure to blood or other potentially infectious material.

Date of Exposure Incident

	ACTIVITY	COMPLETION
•	Contaminated area was washed with soap and water (or eyewash if the eye) for at least 15 minutes.	
•	Employee transported to emergency room within 2 hours of incident for antiviral drugs (following washing/flushing described above).	
•	Employee furnished with documentation regarding exposure incident.	
•	The following documentation was forwarded to a Healthcare Professional who is evaluating employee:	
	o Bloodborne Pathogens Standard	
	Exposure Incident Report	
	o Employee's medical records	
•	Source Individual:	
	o Identified OR it was determined that ID was not feasible (circle one)	
	 Authorization to collect blood requested 	
	 Blood tested OR authorization refused (circle one) 	
•	Source individual's blood results given to exposed employee	
•	Employee informed than any/all follow-up care shall be at no cost to him/her
