

Dear Parent/Guardian(s) and Camper,

We are so excited to have you join us for the second annual Philosophy Summer Camp at Oakland University! Last year our campers explored the topic of civil disagreement. We had a number of interactive sessions with professors and undergraduate students, and we ended the week by brainstorming solutions to pressing ethical issues. This year, in addition to that foundation, we have some new things planned. One sneak preview: we will have outdoor sessions, including a campus-wide scavenger hunt.

Our program this year will be focused around the central theme of *Identity*. This topic can be used as a lens to engage students with core philosophical topics. Faculty will be discussing questions about racial identity, gender politics, and human nature in addition to conducting crash course logic and ethics sessions.

Camp will be taking place July 22-26, 2019. Each day the camp will begin at 10am and conclude at 3pm. Check-in will begin at 9:30am on the first day of camp. Students may check-in each day on the second floor of the Human Health Building. There will be a registration table set up outside room 2086. If you enter the building through the P3 parking lot, you will enter on the second floor. Our registration table will be set up right by the second floor entrance. 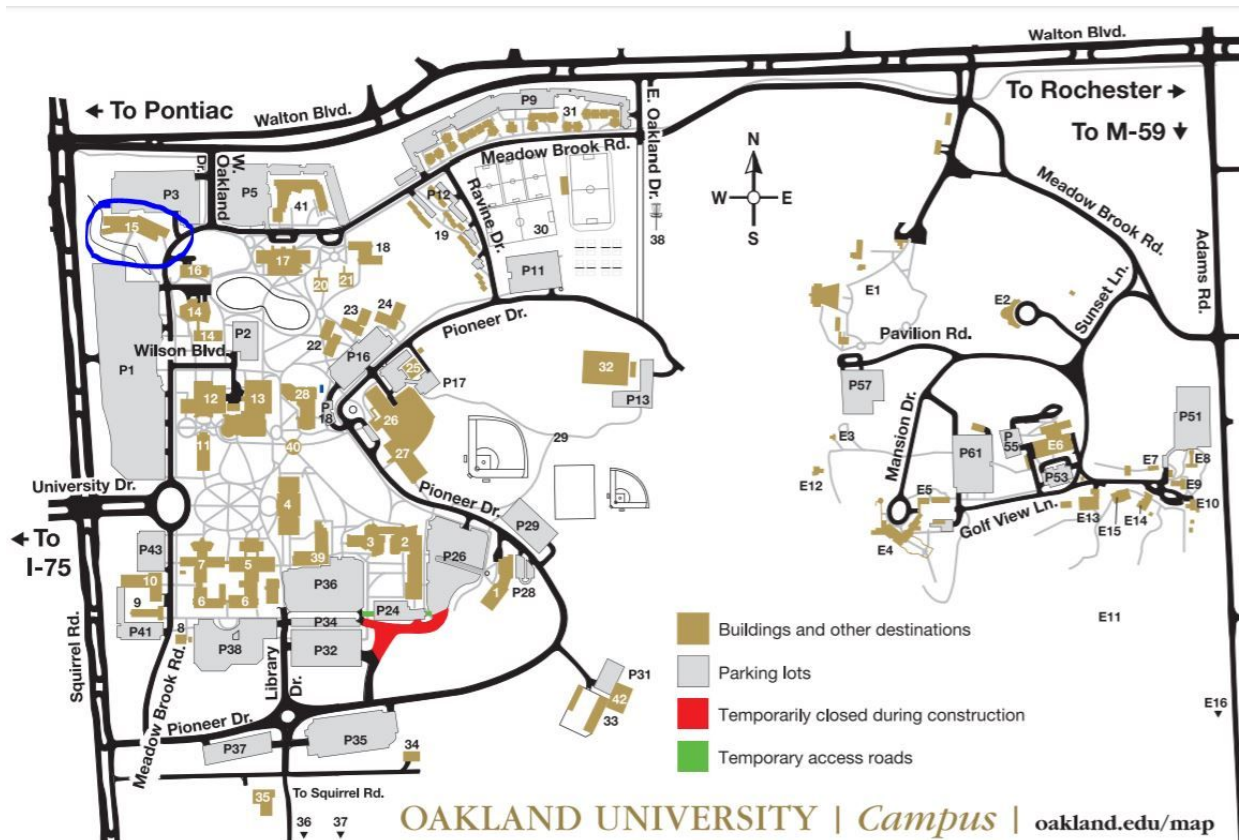

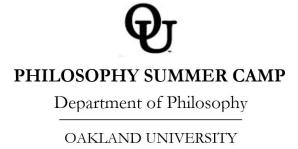
Campers will be checked in each morning at the HUMAN HEALTH BUILDING (HHB).
