Subject: Fall 2012 Enrollment

Official headcount for fall 2012, including students in the School of Medicine (SOM), is 19,740, up by almost 2% over last year, and a new record high. Total FYES production to date for FY12 is 8324, 2.7 % over this point last year. Table I shows the breakout of fall 2012 compared to fall 2011.

The SOM enrollment is included in the graduate totals. 124 SOM students are enrolled for a total of 4,663 credits and 62 FYES. SOM students are enrolled in an average of 37.6 credits, compared to 9.4 credits for full-time doctor's students in other programs, hence the large increase in graduate credits compared to FYES.

Undergraduate enrollment

At 16,190, this is Oakland University's highest ever undergraduate enrollment. First year (FTIAC) enrollment is up 4.4%, to 2,464, about even with the 2009 high of 2,466. The number of new transfers is up to 1,989, setting another record in transfer enrollment (see Table II below). New other (non-degree) enrollment is flat as fewer post-bachelors and non-matriculated students enroll. Enrollment of continuing students is up, although the retention rate for the 2011 cohort dropped to 70.3% from 73% last year.

In fall 2012, 73.4% of undergraduates are enrolled full-time, with a slight increase in average credits, from 12.33 to 12.35. Average credits for new first-year students went from 14.78 to 14.87, as the percent of students enrolled for 14 or more credits went from 68% to 70%. This has been increasing since 2006, and as a result, the proportion of students who were sophomores at the end of the first year has gone from 41% for the 2003 cohort to 53.5% for the 2011 cohort. Being a sophomore in the second year is one of OU's best indicators that a student is on track to graduate within six years.

Graduate enrollment

Overall, graduate headcount is about even with last year (up 0.3%). New graduate enrollment is up 6%, aided by a substantial gain in master's students and the entry of the second class of the School of Medicine. Doctor's level students in other schools are down significantly, while returning graduate enrollment is down by 2.5%. Detail of doctor's level enrollment by program can be found in Appendix A.

Enrollment by school/college

FTIACs are up in Engineering and Computer Science (SECS), Health Science (SHS), the College of Arts and Science (CAS), and Nursing (SON), but down in the School of Business (SBA) and School of Education and Human Services (SEHS). New transfer students are up in SECS, SBA, and CAS.

At the master's level, the college and all the schools except SON show increases. However, new doctor's enrollment is down in SON, SEHS, CAS and SHS.

Table IV shows the rate of increase or decrease in majors, SCH and FYES by school compared to fall 2011. Note that while undergraduate credits dropped by 6% in SON, the FYES did not show a corresponding decrease, because the drop was in competency credits, which are not included in the FYES calculation.

OU in Macomb County

The following tables present enrollment data for the Macomb University Center (MUC and MISD), the Anton-Frankel Center (AFC) and, lastly, the combined enrollment in Macomb.

Table V shows a total of 851 students enrolled at either the Macomb University Center or Intermediate School District, compared to 988 in 2011. Some of the drop in enrollment at this site may be caused by a shift to the AFC.

The Anton-Frankel Center in Mt. Clemens is showing substantial gains in enrollment. There are 640 students enrolled at the AFC, with most of them also enrolled at other locations either on campus or at the MUC.

Note that the only Macomb Oakland partnership (M2O) students included in this data would be those who are enrolled in OU classes at Macomb. We do not yet have complete enrollment data for the CC2O students. There are 459 M2O students enrolled at OU this fall, compared to 457 in 2011. There are also 173 O2O students, six SC2O, and five Mott2O students enrolled at OU.

More detail on fall enrollment will be provided in the fall enrollment report to be published later in the semester.
